HEAD LICE

Do you ever check your child for head lice? We recommend doing this once a month or if your child's scalp itches more than usual.

Head lice have nothing to do with clean or dirty hair, it's just bad luck.

You can get rid of head lice by combing your hair very well. Every day, two weeks in a row with a nit comb. Wet the hair with vinegar to loosen the nits and make combing easier. You can also use a lice shampoo, but even then you have to keep combing well.

THEME ALL-IN-1 ENERGY WEEK 3: FOSSIL FUELS

Info: Fossil fuels

Fossil fuels originated millions of years ago.

Coal, natural gas and petroleum are fossil fuels.

Stocks of fossil fuels are slowly running out.

Coal was formed millions of years ago from layers of earth rotting leaves and dead trees.

The lower layers were compressed more and more.

If the coal is deep in the ground, a mine is created.

Petroleum was created from billions of dead sea creatures.

They fell to the bottom and piled up.

Layers of soil compressed and heated them.

Countries with petroleum are very rich.

The Netherlands extracts natural gas from the bottom of the North Sea.

Gas is used for heating the houses, to make hot water and for cooking.

Natural gas can be easily transported through pipelines.

BC only:

When you burn fossil fuels, you get a lot of energy.

The waste consists of soot and gases.

The gases cause the greenhouse effect.

They form a kind of blanket around the globe, causing the earth to slowly warm up.

C only:

Petroleum is used to make gasoline, diesel and kerosene.

But also for medicines, plastic, asphalt, Lego and shoes.

A refinery is a factory where petroleum is made into petrol, diesel and kerosene.

The petroleum is brought in by seagoing vessels.

Additional Info: Gas stations

You can fill up with petrol, diesel and LPG at a gas station.

These fuels are transported from the refinery to the filling station with tank trucks.

The fuels are made from petroleum.

When you fill up with petrol, unhealthy petrol vapors are released.

The piston in the nozzle sucks the vapor away.

You are not allowed to smoke or use fire at the gas station.

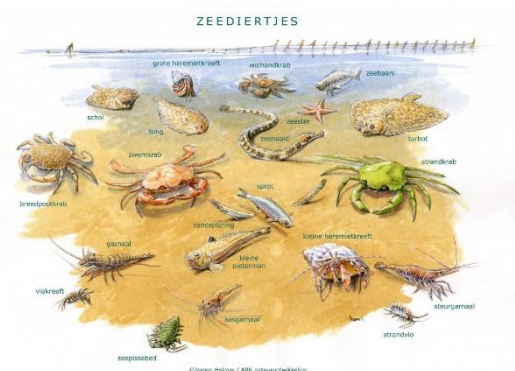
You are also not allowed to make mobile calls. A small spark can cause an explosion!
