



ORGANIZATION AND EDUCATION AFTER JANUARY 4TH

Like you already know the schools will be closed until at least January 18, 2021.

Just like you, we have been surprised with this news and we find it very annoying that the most beautiful time of the year can no longer be celebrated together by our students.

In the past few days we have been busy again providing as many students as possible with a laptop or ipad on loan so that from 4 January we can start home schooling. Fortunately, we have already been able to distribute many devices. Students who have not yet received anything, know that we are busy facilitating this for them.

Group 8 is allowed to go to school in shifts, but more is explained in a separate letter and you have been given a schedule with blocks in which your child is expected at school.

For optimal learning results, it is important for students to have structure and regularity, especially when they are at home. It would therefore be nice if the students were showered, cleaned and dressed at 9 am sharp, logged in to Google Classroom via Cloudwise. From 9 am to 10 am, the students calculate at their own level in their math groups. At 10 am the students have a check-in with the teacher and receive active education. Check-out is at 2 pm and the tasks will be discussed with the teacher. The online school day ends at 2.15 pm. SSV plus will also continue to support SSVplus students online. They themselves contact the students where this relates to. In addition, the teachers must keep a record of the children present every day, so that we can show which children have followed home schooling. Is your kind sick? Again, you must deregister your child via your child's teacher.

We do everything we can to optimize the learning development of your child (ren). It is important that every child completes at least the main subjects as described in the weekly schedule. Try to find a balance yourself to make it feasible for you and your child (ren). Especially if you have several children in different groups. Our teachers are there for you too! Do you have questions? Uncertainties? To care? Discuss this with your child's teacher. Please do this from January 4 between 8:30 AM and 4:00 PM.

EMERGENCY CARE FOR VITAL PROFESSIONS

This time too, emergency shelter is organized for parents with vital professions. This really only concerns parents who cannot arrange anything themselves and can hand over an employer's statement.

Emergency shelter is only available during school hours from 8.30 am to 2.15 pm.

EMERGENCY CARE BEFORE OR AFTER SCHOOL

Emergency care provided by a childcare organization is only available to children of parents who have a contract with the childcare and for the number of hours agreed in the contract. Note: This is different from the situation in the spring. Do you work in a crucial profession and do you want to make use of extra childcare during regular opening hours? In this case, contact your childcare organization to see if an adjustment to your contract is necessary.

LOG IN CLOUDEWISE

At the beginning of this school year, every child received their own Blue Line e-mail and password, check at home whether you have access to the portal. Via Cloude wise you get access to basic gate, google Classroom, world in numbers and much more. This way your child has all digital learning resources under one roof.
