ALL-IN-1 GOLDEN AGE WEEK 1 AND 2

Week 1: The Golden Age (1600-1700)

The 17th century is called the Golden Age, because a lot of money was made in the Netherlands. Mainly because of the trade. Everything was transported by ships. The most trade was therefore in the west, near the North Sea. The wealthy merchants lived close to their trade. They lived in beautiful houses. The painters made portraits of the rich merchants. So there was a lot of art. All kinds of inventions were made. Only BC: Like the clock with the pendulum. The telescope and microscope were also invented. With a telescope you can see how big the universe is. With a microscope you can see bacteria.

Week 2: The 80-year-war (1568-1648)

The Netherlands belonged to Spain in the 16th century. Almost everyone was part of the Catholic Church.

Books were printed for the first time. The people now read the Bible themselves.

They read different things than they heard from church. They rebelled against the church.

They destroyed images: the Iconoclasm. These people were called Protestants.

The king of Spain was furious. He sent General Alva to the Netherlands.

Alva had many Protestants killed and tortured. The Dutch hated the Spaniards. The watergeuzen conquered the city of Den Briel.

More and more cities were conquered from the Spaniards. Peace was signed in Münster (Germany) in 1648. The Netherlands became its own country. The war with Spain had lasted eighty years.
