## ALL-IN-1 GOLDEN CENTURY WEEK 3 AND 4

### Week 3: the VOC and the Indies.

The Portuguese sailed to Asia. They bought spices there.

These are spices, such as pepper, cloves, cinnamon or bay leaf. The Dutch wanted that too.

The merchants teamed up in a company. They founded the VOC in 1602.

The VOC existed for more than two hundred years. The ships usually took silver to trade.

The VOC traded the silver for spices from Asia.

But also for fabrics from India, coffee from Java and tea from China.

These goods were kept in warehouses.

BC only: Some merchants were watching trade in Asia.

"Trading posts" arose.

These trading posts grew into towns.

Only C: The main trading post was Batavia, in the Indies.

That city is now called Jakarta, the capital of Indonesia.
