# Opening the school from the 8th of February

Yay! We can open again. There are a couple rules:

# If your child has a cold, a cough or a fever, let your child stay at home. If there is 1 infection in the group, the whole group must quarantine for 5 days.

So if you have a cough, are snotty or have a fever, stay at home.

## We will provide online lessons via google classroom.

Parents have to stay outside the fence of the schoolyard and the parents must go home immediately after delivery and can not stay to chat at the fence.

The pupils of the Blauwe Lijn enter the schoolyard through the gate which is closest to the school.

The school is open from 8:00 so that the students can enter immediately.

The students stay in their own classes for lessons and stay seated as much as possible and do not walk around, There will be enough ventilation in the classes, always let the students have a cardigan or sweater with them; it could be cold without.

The students of groups 7 and 8 do not have to wear a face mask.

Walking routes have been created in the school and of course everyone continues to wash their hands a lot.

Broad school activities are not on the program yet.

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#### HAND IN DEVICES

Fortunately, the Blue Line will be open again from Monday 8 February. This means that the Laptops / chromebookes and IPads must be returned on Monday. On Monday, the students take the device to school with the charger and the loan letter and give the device to the teacher. Ms Judith and Mr Marc will check the device.

Borrowing a laptop is a temporary solution. Pupils need a laptop to be able to do homework now and in their further school career.

You may be eligible for an arrangement for purchasing your own laptop with the municipality.

Our colleague Djemilla from MADI (who also scans the city passes) can contact you and check with you whether you are eligible for such a scheme.

You can also contact her to apply for a city pass, student allowance, sports fund, culture fund, bicycle application and other budget advice. Take your city pass with you to school so that we can provide a copy for any arrangement from the municipality. You can also contact us directly:

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### **ALL-IN-1 GOLDEN AGE WEEK 5**

In the 16th century, the House of Orange consisted of separate countries. The countries belonged to Spain. William of Orange wanted to help the Dutch. He helped in the fight against Spain. William of Orange had two nicknames:

- o the Father of the Fatherland, because he took care of the Dutch like a father.
