The Blauwe Lijn is very shocked that corona has entered our bubble and therefore we had to send two classes home. Fortunately, we have it under control at the moment, but we cannot do this alone. The agreements below are very important to keep the school open for as long as possible. Only together we can keep corona under control ..

- If your child has a cold, cough, or fever, keep your child at home.
 Your child can go back to school if he / she is free of complaints for 2 days or has a negative test.
- If there is an infection in the group, the whole group must stay at home for 10 days.
 The children can go back to school after 10 days if they are free of complaints, they can go to school earlier if they can hand over a negative test.
- Do you, as a parent or other family member over 12 years of age, have corona-related complaints? Keep your child at home until you are free of complaints for 2 days or can hand over a negative test.
- Pupils who are at home for a longer period of time as a result of corona in the family are taught online.
- Corona positive within your household? Everyone must stay at home, follow the GGD guidelines.
 As a parent, you know your child best. Are you unsure whether it is a special case?
 Talk about it, we are here for you!

BALANCE IN CLASSROOM, LIFE LESSONS

"Ms., I get angry so quickly, what can I do to feel calmer?"

This is one of the many questions I often get from children when I teach my Balance in the Classroom lessons.

Children learn skills to deal with stress and discomfort, they learn how to express an emotion, and through breathing exercises they can always feel calmer.

The consequences of stress on the health and wellbeing of children are abundantly clear. Burn-out complaints are also increasingly common in children.

My name is Hanke den Boer, and I have been a teacher for many years.

Since 2008 I have been teaching children's yoga and from 2015, I have been teaching Balance in the Classroom at schools and training teachers.

The life lessons come from mindfulness, yoga, breathing exercises, mutual massages, stories with insight and collaboration exercises.

I will be teaching the 8-week playful but effective course at The Blauwe Lijn from April onwards to groups 1-4.

ALL-IN-1 TRAFFIC AND TRANSPORT WEEK 4 AND 5

The theme of Transport and Traffic has been going on for almost 3 weeks now.

More information about what they are now learning about this theme can be found in this letter.

Theme: Traffic and Transport

Last week it concerned different types of roads:

Highways are built on behalf of the government. Motorways can be recognized by the letter A in the road number, such as the A7. Many highways also have an E number. Then such a road is an important European connecting road. The province takes care of the provincial roads. The letter N stands in front of the road number, such as N337. Municipalities are also building roads through cities and towns. The municipality maintains these municipal roads.



This week the children learn about the trains, tram, and metro:

After the steam trains came the diesel trains. Most trains now run on electricity. They are powered by the overhead lines. Trains run on rails made of long steel bars. Concrete sleepers lie under those bars. There are different types of passenger trains. Stop trains run for short stretches and stop at many stations. Sprinters are slow trains that accelerate and brake quickly. Express trains (intercity trains) only stop at major stations. Double deck trains have two floors. International trains run abroad. High-speed trains can travel faster than 300 kilometers per hour. A tram runs on rails through the streets of a city. You can travel by metro in Amsterdam and Rotterdam. Metro lines are mostly underground. They are learning so much, ask them yourself!
