## CITO GROUP 8

Your son or daughter's last year of primary school. A very important year.

A year in which a choice is made for secondary education.

Your child has of course already received preliminary advice.

For one it was a clear confirmation, for the other it was a motivation to do even more in the coming months. Because even in group 8, a child still learns a lot.

And a student can also undergo enormous development in group 8.

We would like to ask you as a parent not to schedule any other appointments during this period, such as a general practitioner, dentist or other appointments.

It is important that the students have a good breakfast in the morning and go to bed on time for good concentration during the tests.

If the result of the central final test deviates from the final advice given earlier, the teacher (s) of group 8, the internal counselor and the principal can look at the advice again. The reconsideration of advice is discussed in a conversation with the student and parents / guardians. During that conversation, it is announced whether the advice will be adjusted.

During the tests, the children are allowed to bring chewing gum and water.

Note: please no fruit chewing gum.

It would be nice if the students also bring well-functioning earplugs.



## LEARNING HOW TO READ SAFELY KERN 10: LOOK AROUND YOU

The theme of kern 10 is in line with what happens or can happen in nature. In the anchor story "A sheep in the tree", Willem is confronted with all kinds of natural phenomena. We discuss matters such as weather conditions, the landscape and the living environment with the children. They learn words like: the earth, the brook, cloudy, the hill, the calf, the drizzle, shelter and the downpour. Word types in kern 10

The new word types they learn in kern 10 are:

- Words of one syllable that end with -eeuw, -ieuw or -uw, zoals: leeuw, nieuw and duw;
- One-syllable words ending in four consonants, like: herfst and sterkst;
- words of two syllables which first syllable is an open syllable, such as: bomen;
- two-syllable words that start with two or three consonants and which first syllable is an open syllable, such as: knopen and strepen;
- words of one or two syllables with in the middle of the word -ng-, -nk-, -ch- or -aai-, -ooi-, -oei-, like: langzaam and zwaaien;
- words of one or two syllables with in the middle of the word -eeuw-, -ieuw- or -uw-, like: leeuwen and ruwe.

The theme traffic and transport is now in week 5.

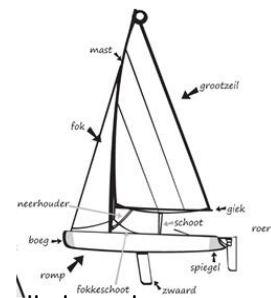

Theme: Traffic and Transport

Last week it was about: Transport by water

Container ships can hold up to 15,000 containers. Tankers usually carry oil. Mammoth tankers are sometimes as long as 500 meters. Large container ships and mammoth tankers are seagoing ships. Inland vessels sail on rivers and canals. For example, they transport sand, coal or containers. Push boats push large barges forward. Passenger ships transport people. Ferries usually run between the mainland and an island. Ferries are for cyclists and pedestrians. The ferries sail back and forth over a river or canal.

The wind in your sails: You cannot sail against the wind with a sailing boat. But diagonally to the wind:



This week the children learn about space and air travel

Large passenger aircraft have jet engines. The hot air propels the plane forward. Small planes have a propeller engine. That's a big screw on the nose of the plane. Gliders are pulled into the air with a cable. The pilot and co-pilot control the aircraft. They're in the cockpit. The air traffic controllers are in the control tower of an airport. They have radio contact with the plane. And give permission to land or take off. Stewards take care of the passengers.

Space Travel: Space begins outside the Earth's atmosphere. There is no air in space. Astronauts therefore wear spacesuits with a supply of air. And they learn a lot more! Just ask.
