VLL KERN 3: HOW DO YOU FEEL?

This time Grandpa tells Kim the story about an emperor who calls a doctor for every sore or spot; he has a thousand doctors. The theme of this core is: 'How do you feel?' and is about being sick and getting better. In this core children learn, among other things, the meaning of words about being sick, your body and feelings.

Reading letters and words in core 3

The new letters in core 3 are: d, oe, z, ij, h. The letter at core 2 stated that children sometimes interchange the d with the b and that we have learned a gesture for this (first the leg (stick) then the ball (circle)). At the d the ball is on the other side. we do not teach a separate gesture.

The children practice reading and making words that consist of one syllable with the letters they know, such as cheese, eat and no. Being able to read and make words such as 'spaak' and 'kaart' are not yet a goal, but the children do have the opportunity to 'sniff' these words and try if they can read and make these words.

The children who work with sun materials learn to read the following word types:

- monosyllabic words starting with 'sch', such as: schoen, schuilt;
- monosyllabic words ending in 'ng': ring, slank;
- monosyllabic words ending in 'nk': bank, klank;
- monosyllabic words ending in 'd': koud, hard;
- monosyllabic words ending in 'b': web, krab;
- monosyllabic words with a letter cluster in front and at the back: dwerg, klant, bond.

ALLES-IN-1 THEME ART: WEEK 1

Art can be different kinds of dance, music, paintings, drama and sculptures. Sculpture or statues are usually made of stone, wood, clay or metal.

The stone statues of the pharaohs in Egypt are up to 20 meters high and sometimes more than 4000 years old.

The Terracotta Army in China is a 2,000-year-old sculpture of 8,000 soldiers.

These statues stood in a burial vault of a Chinese emperor.

The Greeks made statues of white marble from 500 to 300 BC.

The Romans destroyed many of these statues, but also copied them. In the 14th and 15th centuries, Italian artists used these statues as examples.

Until a hundred years ago, images usually had to do with faith or power. After 1900, the feeling that an image conveys became increasingly important. There is a statue in almost every town or village. Often even more than one.
