CAMP GROUP 8

Camp preparations are in full swing. This year we are going to “De Haverkamp” in Hengelo. We will do this from **Monday 21 June to Wednesday 23 June.**

You have now received a letter to arrange the payments for camp.

The total amount including voluntary parental contribution is **€150.**

In consultation with the parent council, it has been decided to include the amount of the parental contribution from last school year in the payment for camp.

Is there still an amount left? You will receive a letter with the amount that is still outstanding.

You can transfer the amount to account **number NL47INGB0009216405** in the name of **Stichting beheer ouderraadsgelden**, stating 'School camp group 8' and the name and group of your child.

Do you have a Stadspas? Pay € 55 for the parental contribution with the Stadspas.

The students can only join if the amount has been paid before June 16 or it has been agreed how and when the amount will be paid.

SCAN YOUR CITY PASS

We notice that the city passes have been scanned less this school year than last year.

Parents are often asked whether the credit of €55 will be at the expense of their clothing voucher or student allowance, this is not the case.

Paying the parental contributions with the city pass is a separate arrangement that is separate from your other credits. If you do not scan your city pass, the credit for that year will be lost and will not be refunded.

This school year we have decided that students from group 8 can pay with the city passes already scanned in last school year and this school year. This leaves only an amount of €45 euros instead of €95 euros.

It is therefore very important to scan your city pass with us at all times, you will not lose anything. **Especially for group 7, your city pass credit will then be taken to camp next school year!**

Amphibians
